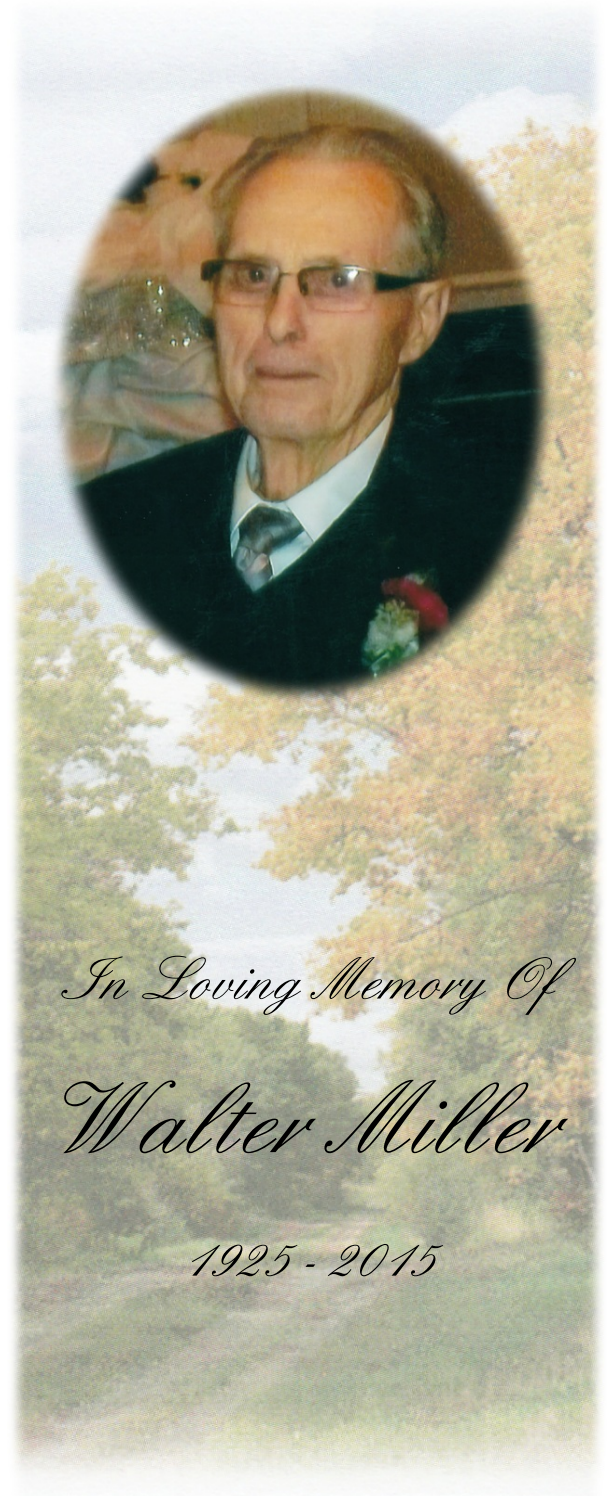
God saw him getting tired,
